

TUTORING

When a student is experiencing academic difficulty, teachers shall make assistance available at Assistance shall be provided for any student who needs help in his/her academic work by the student's teacher(s). Staff members are required to make themselves available to students needing extra help.

In the event that a student needs special tutoring beyond regular school teacher assistance, the principal/supervisor of special services and parents/guardians of the child shall agree upon the necessary tutoring schedule.

Teachers employed by the Board shall refrain from tutoring students in their current class(es) for a fee.

A tutoring program may include use of other district students especially proficient in the particular subject. Such student-tutors shall be under the direct supervision of an appropriate staff member
